How do I log onto Stonewall Learning?

Video transcript

Speaker: In this video we'll be showing you how to log on and get started with Stonewall Learning. First we'll show you how to log on, how to start your module and then how to continue it.

Speaker: The first thing I need to do is go to learning.stonewall.org.uk/account, put in the email address I registered with and my password. Remember this is different to the password that you use for the online shop and it's different to your stonewall.org.uk password that you use to log on and access your member only area and to download the member only resources. So I'm going to click login and it takes me to my training plan where I can see the module that's available to me.

Speaker: So I click on my module and there we go I've got the option to launch the tutorial and I've got the option to launch my first unit so I'm going to click launch unit and I'm ready to get started.

Speaker: This time I've logged back in and we can see that I've already started the module. It tells me it is in progress so if I click on the module this time I can just carry on from where I left off by clicking resume unit.

Speaker: And it's remembered exactly where I got up to.
